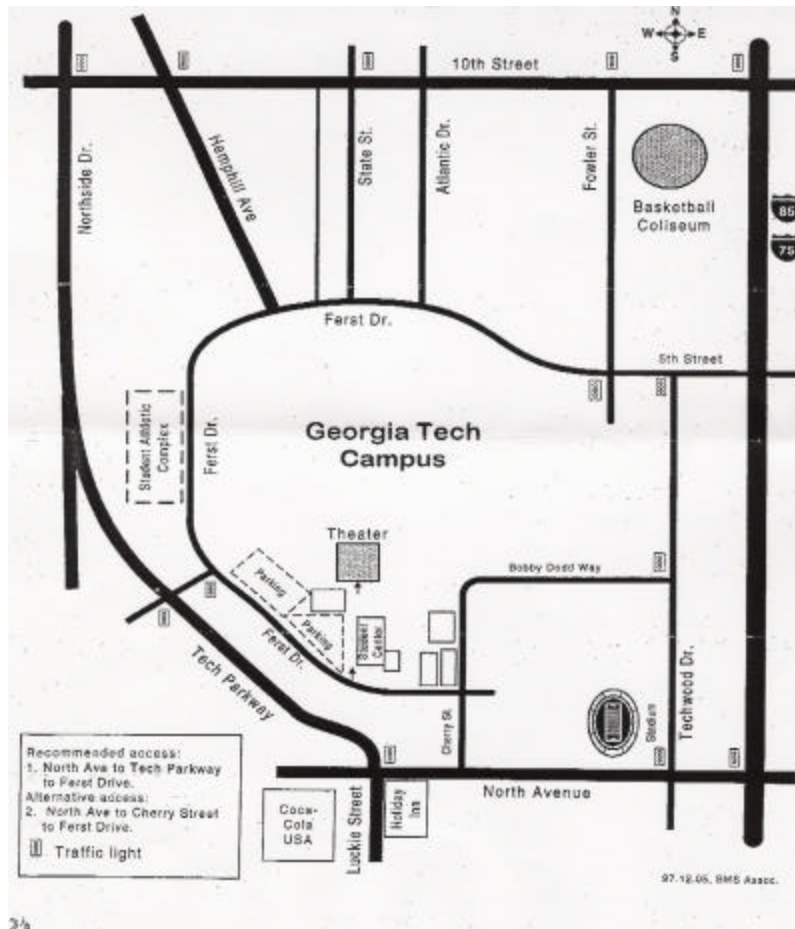

Vassilis Gaitanos

Born in Greece, he spent a large part of his professional life in Chicago, U.S.A. A renowned Greek composer and musician, Vassilis has performed together with the giants Manos Hatzidakis and Mikis Theodorakis, participating in concerts against dictatorship in various cities in Europe and the Americas. He has also collaborated with M. Plessas, G. Katsaros, Y. Voyatzis, F. Polymeri, M. Melagia, T.

Marouda, and H. Lemonopoulos. Recently, he set to music extracts from the works of the famous Nicaraguan poet Cardinal.

He has performed three times in the White House, during the presidencies of Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, and Bill Clinton, and once in the U.S. Capitol. He has received numerous awards and recognitions from different universities and associations, and he has been honored by the former Ecumenical Patriarch Demetrios, the Patriarch of Moscow Alexios, the former Archbishop of Cyprus Makarios, the former Archbishop of South and North America Iakovos, and the Mayor of Chicago, Richard Daley.

Mrs. Dimitra Gaitanos was born in Athens, Greece. She is a graduate of the Law School of the University of Athens, Department of Political Science and Public Administration. Currently, she is recording her first album based on music composed by her husband, Vassilis.

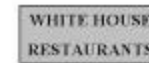
